PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is developing a corridor management plan for K-254 in Sedgwick and Butler counties. The area includes 22 miles of K-254 from Wichita on the west to El Dorado on the east (and within 1 mile of the highway).

The goal of the K-254 Corridor Management Plan is to establish future land development and access management approaches that serve the communities while keeping traffic moving efficiently and safely.

Proposed short-term improvements:

- Restricted Crossing U-turns (RCUTs)
- Acceleration and deceleration lanes
- Pavement markings
- Rumble strips
- Lighting

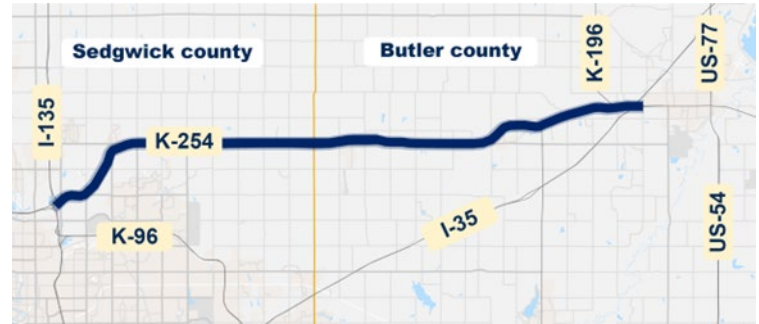
Proposed long-term improvements:

- Interchanges
- Overpasses
- Intersection closures
- Frontage roads
