

PROJECT **UPDATE**

The K-4 modernization project in Saline County includes the reconstruction of existing K-4 from the Smoky Hill River Bridge east to Kipp Road. The new alignment of K-4 will be offset to the north through a majority of the project limits to improve sight distance and add paved shoulders. Traffic will be maintained during construction via existing K-4. Temporary widening or closures with detours may be required at the eastern limits of the project.


The project was identified as a regional priority at Local Consult meetings in 2019, and the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) responded with practical improvements which address long-term safety and mobility concerns along this well-traveled highway.

K-4 Saline County is one of three Modernization highway projects in north central Kansas that have been added to the Development Pipeline as part of the Eisenhower Legacy Transportation Program (IKE). While a construction letting has not yet been funded at this time, it will be evaluated as the design process continues.

This is the first of two public meetings planned throughout the design process. The next public meeting will be in April 2022, with 60% Design Plans complete in May 2022. The 90% Design Plans will be complete in December 2023 and Final Design Plans (100%) complete in April 2024.
