



U.S. 77 PAVEMENT REPLACEMENT ARKANSAS CITY TO WINFIELD IN COWLEY COUNTY



PROJECT OVERVIEW



KDOT is currently planning pavement replacement on nearly 9 miles of U.S. 77 between Arkansas City and the Walnut River bridge on the south side of Winfield in Cowley County. The project includes highway preservation, offset alignment on the south side of Strother Field and redecking of the southbound bridge over the BNSF railroad.

Intersection improvements are being proposed at 222nd Road, as well as realignment of D Street to improve visibility. The 1st Avenue intersection would be closed to enhance driver safety near the Strother Field Industrial Park.

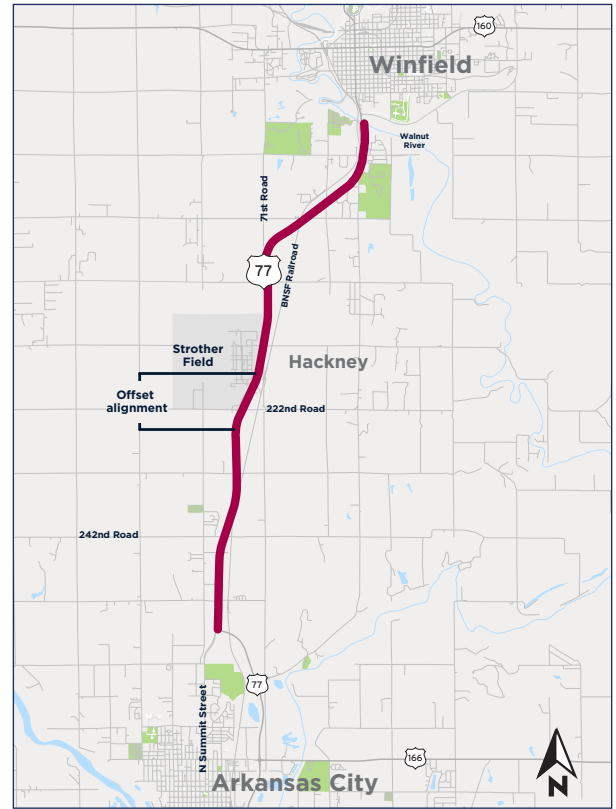
Contractor selection is planned for June of 2024. The earliest construction is anticipated to begin would be spring of 2025 with estimated completion in late 2026.
