





WHAT'S **HAPPENING**

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is continuing to develop long-term plans and construction phasing that will improve K-68 in Miami County. The project team is currently focusing on Project No. KA-2373-04, which involves developing design plans that expand 6.68 miles of K-68 to four lanes between US-169 and Spring Valley Road (just west of US-69 at Louisburg). Public officials briefings and public meetings will provide the community with information about the current status of the project. KA-2373-04 is one of the seven announced Eisenhower Legacy Transportation Program (IKE) Modernization / Expansion Projects in the Development Pipeline for KDOT District 4 (Southeast Kansas). Design is anticipated to be complete during 2023. No construction funding has been identified at this time. It is also part of a corridor management plan including the K-68 T-WORKS projects described in the table below.



Upgrading K-68 with a series of improvements at key locations plus a long-term goal of widening to a four-lane roadway is recommended in the *K-68 Corridor Management Plan*. KDOT and the consultant team began developing conceptual improvement plans for the *Miami County K-68 Expansion Project* in 2012. They have since modified them to respond to community feedback, field surveys, and detailed engineering analysis.
